Lesson Structure

Daily Review

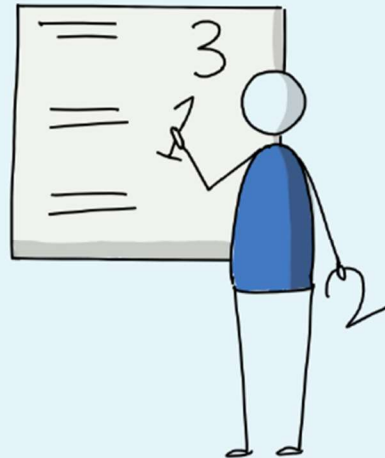
Low-stakes assessment promoting recall from everyone. Includes required material for the lesson.

Learning Intentions

Clearly communicate what students are learning in student-friendly language. Revisited during lesson.

Success Criteria

Communicate what success looks like using 'I can...' statements, key features, and exemplars. Supports feedback.



Presenting Content

Recap prior learning, present content clearly with explanations and visuals. Interactive with checks for understanding.

Practice

Guided, supported, then independent practice
Co-operative learning opportunities.
Over-learning content.

Plenary Review

Revisit learning intentions and success criteria.
Reinforce main points and gather further evidence about learning.



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Key Principles of Every Lesson



Differentiated Support

Support students through teacher, peer, checklists, and scaffolds. Offer differentiated challenges and balance content levels.

Questioning Strategies

Utilise strategies like show-me boards, pose-pause-pounce-bounce, discussions, and active assessments to engage all students.

Feedback Importance

Continuous verbal feedback is powerful. Be specific, supportive, link to success criteria, and provide time for students to act on feedback.

Feedback Delivery

Deliver feedback verbally, be clear and precise, offer support and next steps, connect to success criteria, and include individual and whole-class messages.





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Learning Environment

Building Relationships

Develop positive interactions through knowing students well, praising sincerely, and fostering teacher-student and student-student relationships.



Setting High Expectations

Establish high standards for effort, behavior, and work quality. Encourage goal setting and personal bests to motivate students.

Effective Management

Maintain a calm, safe, and organised environment. Utilise time, space, and resources effectively while maintaining an appropriate pace.

Managing Behavior

Create a warm-strict atmosphere where students are engaged, on task and motivated. Address poor behaviors promptly and with minimal disruption using our Positive Relationships Policy.
