Welcome back to a new school session and we hope you all enjoyed a restful October break. There are lots of dates for your diary as this is a busy term. **Absences / Neo-Lathaireachdean:** If your child is going to be absent from sgoil araich or school, please can you give this information to the school in advance. If your child is absent unexpectedly on any given day, please phone the school on 01470 521307 or email <a href="mailto:dunvegan.primary@highland.gov.uk">dunvegan.primary@highland.gov.uk</a> before 09.30am, this applies for nursery children also.

Adverse weather number/Droch-thide: As we enter the more inclement seasons, there could be instances that the weather prevents the school from opening. The Head Teacher will send out a message on Seesaw with information on school opening times. Please be aware that adverse weather can be very localised and it can take time to gather all relevant information, and in some cases a late opening may be called.

**Visitors / Neach-tadhail:** If you are visiting the school for any reason, please enter the school grounds using the small pedestrian gate and buzz the door, someone will then let you in. Please then report to the office on arrival. If you need to contact the school during the school day, please note that the office is not always manned, and messages can be left on the answering machine. Thank you.

**School Dinner Money / Airgead Dinneir:** School lunches are available to all children in full time education, and are FREE up until they reach P6 & 7 when the cost is £2.40 per day.

**Clothing / Aodach:** Please can you write your child's name on their clothing, especially school jumpers. This helps us so much when we are trying to return 'lost items'. Please could we ask all children to bring in a pair of indoor crocs, trainers or shoes (NOT SLIPPERS) that will only be worn inside the school building. This will help to keep our carpets, cushions, rugs etc. clean and dry. If you

prefer, wellies for outside play are a great alternative. It is also a good idea to make sure that ALL children have a spare change of clothes in school.

**YMI / Ceol:** YMI music sessions will take place this term for our upper classes.

Swimming / Snamh: Our swimming blocks for the year have been confirmed on the following dates:

GM 4-7 week beginning 17th November

EM 5-7 week beginning 24th November

Mixed group - week beginning 26th January

EM 1-4 week beginning 23rd March

When your child is on their swimming block, they will travel to and from Portree on the Community Minibus & possibly a staff car, they are in the pool for 1 hour. Please make sure that they have their full swim kits, to include towel, goggles, swim wear. They are to bring their snack and water bottle with them for after their session.

Nursery / Sgoil Araich: Our nursery is open full time hours, from 9am – 3pm each day.

- Please can children have a pair of indoor shoes (NOT slippers), a change of clothes and a waterproof jacket each day.

**Headlice / Mialan:** Head Lice are a common problem in school aged children. They can't be prevented, but regular checking ensures early detection and treatment if necessary. Parents and carers should check their children's head once a week during hair washing. You need your usual shampoo, conditioner, and a detection comb – ask your local pharmacist to recommend a suitable one. Remember that you are looking for living moving lice, the only evidence that your child is infected. If you find a living louse, ask your local pharmacist, school nurse, health visitor or GP for advice regarding treatment.

**End of Term / Deireadh an teirm:** School & Sgoil Araich will close for the Christmas Break on Tuesday 23rd December and re-open on Wednesday 7th January 2026.
